Selecting Qualifier(s)

- Dates & Locations

 - <u>http://www.usfirst.org/whatsgoingon</u> (Note: The Naval Academy and St. Mary's qualifiers are not shown when the search is limited to events in Maryland.)
- Cost
 - \$150 / Team / Event
 - No additional registration fee for the Maryland FTC Championship

Registration

- Team Roster & Consent and Release Forms
 - Coach registers for season (via TIMS)
 - Student applies (via STIMS)
 - Student and parent/legal guardian receive confirmation e-mail (via personal e-mail)
 - Parent/legal guardian completes user profile (via STIMS)
 - Parent/legal guardian completes consent and release form (via STIMS)
 - Coach accepts student(s) onto the team (via TIMS)
 - Print the team roster (via TIMS)
 - Attach all paper copies to team roster
 - Coach or team leaders bring the team roster and all consent and release forms to the registration table
 - All students and mentors must be on the team roster and/or have a <u>SIGNED</u> consent and release form to participate in the qualifiers and state championship
 - Some events collect the notebooks at registration; some collect them during the team's judging session
 - Receive your driver buttons and information packet Return these to the registration desk before you leave the event.

Team Roster

You MUST print and bring a copy of your team roster to ALL FTC events.

Please review your Team Roster. Every team contact, mentor, and student must be listed on your team roster and should be handed in at your event registration table. If a team contact is not displayed on the Team Roster or a student has not yet applied online to be a team member, please handwrite the student or mentor's name on the bottom part of the Team Roster and a signed paper Consent & Release form will be required at the event.

Consent & Release Forms

Participation at any event is not guaranteed until a completed FIRST Consent & Release Form is submitted for every team member (mentor and student) attending an FTC event. Student Team Members under 18 must have a parent or legal guardian's signature on their form. If students have completed the consent form electronically, you do not need to bring a paper or printed copy of the consent form for those students, as the Team Roster indicates the form was completed online. If a student chooses to complete the form on paper, please bring the signed paper consent form with your Team Roster to ALL FTC events. Adult mentors must complete the paper form.

You MUST bring a signed PAPER Consent and Release Form to ALL FTC events for:

- 1. Adult Team Mentors
- 2. If Student Team Members have NOT completed electronic Consent & Release form, a signed paper form is required at ALL FTC events.

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Pits

- Bring your own safety glasses.
 - Safety glasses are required to be worn in the pit at all times
- It is recommended that you bring a power strip for robot and NXT batteries and to charge your laptop
- Tablecloths, displays, banners, and swaps make the pit area a social gathering place
- At least one team member should remain in the pit
 - Judges often visit the pit after the judging session.
 - Visitors may have questions for the team.
 - Note that all team members are expected to attend the opening ceremony.

Inspection

- There are three types
 - Hardware
 - Software
 - Field
- Hardware and software can happen in any order, but field inspection must happen last
- Bring your Bill of Materials
 - Making two copies is recommended
 - One for the engineering notebook
 - One for inspection

Inspection Tips

- Self-Inspection
 - Use the inspection in the game manual BEFORE attending the event
- Size Limitation (Game rule RG04)
 - The robot must fit in the cube available at the event.
 - Maximum size is 18X18X18
- Power Switch (Game rule RG05)
- Robot battery and NXT battery (Game rule RG06, RG10)
 - Batteries must be securely attached to the robot
 - Only one battery per robot (TETRIX or MATRIX, but not both)
 - Only one NXT battery per robot
 - Sensor/Touch Multiplexor
 - Battery allowed for visible light LEDs
- Samantha & NXT (Game rule RG07)
 - Must be mounted in an accessible and visible location
 - Must be accessible and visible
- Flag Holder (Game rule RG08)
- Robot Numbers (Game rule RG09)
 - Need to be 3" tall and 1/2" stroke with a contrasting background on at least two opposite sides
 - Durable enough to withstand game play
- Software & Firmware (Game rules RS03, RS04, RS05, RS06)
 - RobotC Firmware 9.0 or later; Labview Firmware 1.31 or later)
 - Samostat must be installed before inspection
 - Program Chooser must be installed before inspection
 - Sleep Timer needs to be set to never

Read the game rules carefully

Judging

- Notebooks
 - Some events collect the notebooks at registration; some collect them during the team's judging session
 - Collect your team's notebooks before leaving the event.
- Schedule
 - Some events have judging before qualifying rounds; some have judging during qualifying events
- Pit
 - Displays help the judges (and other volunteers, visitors, etc.) become familiar with your team
 - After formal judging, judges will contact teams in the pit.
- Qualifying Matches
 - At many events, a judge will be assigned to watch the matches.
 - Consistent performance will be scored during the qualifying matches.
- Remember that awards are given for characteristics other than robot performance.
 - Practice your presentation many times before the event, so everyone feels comfortable.
 - Everyone should be aware of all parts of the team: robot, outreach, etc.

Coach and Driver Meeting

- Meet key volunteers
- It is usually located near the competition fields
- Topics
 - Clarify Rules
 - Read the game rules before attending the meeting
 - Have specific questions
 - Question Box Only students will be allowed to present concerns; adults will be asked to leave
 - Queuing Area Usually near the competition fields

Opening Ceremony

- It is usually located near the competition fields.
- Speakers
 - Host
 - Event Sponsor(s)
- National Anthem
- ALL team members should be present

Qualifying Rounds

- Match schedules are not generated until ALL teams on the event's roster are registered or have contacted a leading volunteer
 - If you can't arrive to the event before the event starts, contact the host, Bill Duncan, Kevin Rudd, or Rose Young.
 - If you decide to skip the tournament, contact the host, Bill Duncan, Kevin Rudd, or Rose Young.
 - This is VERY IMPORTANT; attending teams anxiously wait for the match schedule, and if you are on the event roster (whether you have paid or not), contact someone at the tournament.
- Number
 - Plan to have between 5 and 7 rounds.
 - Spare batteries are recommended
 - Charge your batteries between rounds
 - Bring your own chargers
 - Bringing extra power strips is recommended
- Queuing
 - Bring your robot, robot battery, NXT, NXT battery and <u>safety glasses</u>
 - Arrive BEFORE your match is scheduled
 - You are not allowed to place your robot on the field after the countdown has started
 - Matches may run early pay attention
 - Treat queuers with respect they are volunteering their time don't rely on them to notify you, they serve as a reminder ONLY
- Representatives
 - If your robot is not functional, send a team member to the match
 - Your alliance partner will at least know why your robot is not there.
 - Your team earns ranking points, if your alliance mate wins.
 - Your team may NOT be allowed to send a representative to a match, if your robot has not yet passed inspection.

Scouting

- Recording information about other teams will help during alliance selection
 - Even if you aren't able to select teams, a selecting team may benefit from your information
 - The information could include
 - Gracious Professionalism on and off of the field
 - Durability
 - Scoring Ability
 - Sensor Support
 - Etc.
- Remain in the main seating area, don't edge up to the field.

Food

- There will be very little time for lunch and lunch time depends on match times.
- Check with the host to determine whether the event is offering prepackaged food.
- Plan ahead by searching for nearby restaurants.
- Use this time to gather as a team and celebrate your season.
- Consider packing snacks for consumption throughout the day.

Alliance Selection

- Qualifier Sizes
 - Qualifiers
 - Usually the top four ranked teams choose one other team to join the alliance.
 - Championship
 - Usually the top four ranked teams choose two other teams to join the alliance.
- Selection Order
 - Alliance captain 1 chooses, then 2, then 3, and then 4.
 - Alliance captain 1 chooses a second pick*, then 2, then 3, and then 4.
 - Alliance captains can choose other alliance captains
 - If the lower ranked captain accepts, then lower ranked teams move up (have scouting info ready);
 - If the lower ranked captain declines, then they must decline all other offers; captains may decline without losing their ranking.

Elimination Rounds

- Semi-Finals
 - The number 1 ranked alliance and number 4 ranked alliance play the first match.
 - The number 2 ranked alliance and number 3 ranked alliance play the second match.
 - The number 1 and 4 alliance will play again. If an alliance wins two matches, then that alliance proceeds to the finals.
 - The number 2 and 3 play again. The best 2 out of 3 proceeds to the finals.
 Semi Finals
 Finals
 Champion
- Finals
 - The winners of the semi-finals play.
 - The best 2 out of 3 become the winning alliance.
 - The other alliance becomes the finalist alliance.
